1. General Conditions for Tender

Mercy Corps invites offers for the goods, services and/or works described and summarized in this tender document in accordance with procedures, conditions and contract terms presented herein. Mercy Corps reserves the right to vary the quantity of work/materials specified in the tender package without any changes in unit price or other terms and conditions and to accept or reject any, all, or part of submitted offers.

1. Mercy Corps' Anti-Bribery and Anti-Corruption Statement

Mercy Corps strictly prohibits:

- Any form of bribe or kickback in relation to its activities
This prohibition includes any *request* from any Mercy Corps employee, consultant or agent for anything of value from any company or individual in exchange for the employee, consultant or agents taking or not taking any action related to the award of a contract or the contract once awarded. It also applies to any *offer* from any company or individual to provide anything of value to any Mercy Corps employee, consultant or agent in exchange for that person taking or not taking any action related to the award of the contract or the contract.
- Conflicts of interests in the awarding or management of contracts
If a company is owned by, whether directly or indirectly, in whole or in part, any Mercy Corps employee or any person who is related to a Mercy Corps employee, the company must ensure that it and the employee disclose the relationship as part of or prior to submitting the offer.
- The sharing or obtaining of confidential information
Mercy Corps prohibits its employees from sharing, and any offerors from obtaining, confidential information related to this solicitation, including information regarding Mercy Corps' price estimates, competing offerors or competing offers, etc. Any information provided to one offeror must be provided to all other offerors.
- Collusion between/among offerors

Mercy Corps requires fair and open competition for this solicitation. No two (or more) companies submitting bids can be owned or controlled by the same individual(s). Companies submitting offers cannot share prices or other offer information or take any other action intended to pre-determine which company will win the solicitation and what price will be paid.

Mercy Corps will investigate allegations fully and will take appropriate action. Any company, or individual that participates in any of the above prohibited conduct, will have its actions reported to the appropriate authorities, will be investigated fully, will have its offer rejected and/or contract terminated, and will not be eligible for future contracts with Mercy Corps. Employees participating in such conduct will have his/her employment terminated.

Violations will also be reported to Mercy Corps' donors, who may also choose to investigate and debar or suspend companies and their owners from receiving any contract that is funded in part by the donor, whether the contract is with Mercy Corps or any other entity.

Tender Basis:

- All offers shall be made in accordance with these instructions, and all documents requested should be furnished, including any required (but not limited to) supplier-specific information, technical specifications, drawings, bill of quantities, and/or delivery schedule.
- No respondent should add, omit or change any item, term or condition herein. Any deviation from the requested documents/ format should be explained and submitted as an attachment to this tender document.
- Each offer shall be valid for the period of 12 to 24 months from its date of submission.
- All offers should indicate whether they include taxes, compulsory payments, levies and/or duties, including VAT, if applicable. Proof of tax registration and/or exemptions should be included in the offer package.
- Suppliers should ensure that financial offers are devoid of calculation errors. If errors are identified during the evaluation process, the unit price will prevail. If there is ambiguity on the unit price, the selection committee may decide to disqualify the offer.
- Any requests for clarifications regarding this tender that are not addressed in written documents must be presented to Mercy Corps in writing. The answer to any question raised in writing by any offeror will be issued to that offeror. In some cases, Mercy Corps may choose to issue clarifications to all offerors. It is a condition of this tender that no clarification shall be deemed to supersede, contradict,

add to or detract from the conditions hereof, unless made in writing as an addendum to tender and signed by Mercy Corps or its designated representative.

- This tender does not obligate Mercy Corps to execute a contract nor does it commit Mercy Corps to pay any costs incurred in the preparation and submission of bids. Furthermore, Mercy Corps reserves the right to reject any or all offers, if such action is considered to be in the best interest of Mercy Corps.

2.3 Supplier Eligibility

Suppliers may not apply, and will be rejected as ineligible, if they:

- Are not registered companies
- Are bankrupt or in the process of going bankrupt
- Have been convicted of illegal/corrupt activities, and/or unprofessional conduct
- Have been guilty of grave professional misconduct
- Have not fulfilled obligations related to payment of social security and taxes
- Are guilty of serious misinterpretation in supplying information
- Are in violation of the policies outlined in Mercy Corps anti bribery or anti-corruption statement.
- Supplier (or supplier's principals) are on any list of sanctioned parties issued by; or are presently excluded or disqualified from participation in this transaction by: The United States Government or United Nations by the United States Government, the United Kingdom, the European Union, the United Nations, other national governments, or public international organizations.

Additional eligibility criteria, if applicable, are stated in section 3.2 of this tender package.

2.4 Response Documents

Offerors must submit an offer in Mercy Corps offer sheet format in section 6 – Fill in the offer form provided. If supplier uses own format, they MUST ensure it contains all the required documents and information specified in this tender. The itemized price offer sheet is included in the tender package, the offeror must complete and submit it with the rest of their offer.

2.5 Acceptance of Successful Response

Documentation submitted by offerors will be verified by Mercy Corps. The winning offeror will be required to sign a 12 to 24 months' framework contract for the stated items and services at, agreed upon rates at the discretion of Mercy Corps.

2.6 Certification Regarding Terrorism

It is Mercy Corps' policy to comply with humanitarian principles and the laws and regulations of the United States, the European Union, the United Nations, the United Kingdom, host nations, and other applicable donors concerning transactions with or support to individuals or entities that have engaged in fraud, waste,

abuse, human trafficking, corruption, or terrorist activity. These laws and regulations prohibit Mercy Corps from transacting with or providing support to any individuals or entities that are the subject of government sanctions, donor rules, or laws prohibiting transactions or support to such parties.

2.7 Tender Basis:

- All applications shall be made in accordance with the tender documents.
- All applicants will receive identical documents. No applicant should add, omit, or change any item, term or condition on original papers.
- If applicants have any additional requests and conditions, these shall be stipulated in a separate letter accompanying their application.
- Each application shall be valid for the period of 1 to 2 years from its date of submission.
- Any requests for clarifications regarding the project that are not addressed in written documents must be presented to Mercy Corps through email on sd-tenders@mercy Corps.org. The answer to any question raised by any applicant will be directed to all tenderers at the discretion of Mercy Corps. It is a condition of this tender that no clarification shall be deemed to supersede, contradict, add to or detract from the conditions hereof, unless made in writing and signed by Mercy Corps or its designated representative.

2. Criteria & Submittals

3.1 Contract Terms

Mercy Corps intends to issue a **fixed pricing/ fixed rates** contract to one or several company(ies) or organization(s). The successful offeror(s) shall be required to adhere to the statement of work and terms and conditions of the resulting contract. By submitting an offer, offerors certify that they understand and agree to all of the terms and clauses contained in this document.

3.2 Specific Eligibility Criteria

Eligibility criteria must be met, and the corresponding supporting documents listed below under “Tender Submittals” **must** be submitted with offers. Offerors who do not submit these documents may be **disqualified** from any further technical or financial evaluation.

Eligibility Criteria:

1. Country minimum standards for suppliers are included in all tenders.

 - Company Registration certificate
 - Taxation certification
 - Bank information (Headed paper stamped from the bank)

2. Additional Criteria:

- Legal Business Registration, Valid Tax Registration Certificate, bank account, experience certificates is required.

- Meets the technical specifications as required.
- Delivery Time for implementation it is not more than a month is required.
- Past experience -at least 2 years' experience and attached the certificates.
- Supplier (or supplier's principals) have not been convicted or found guilty of illegal, corrupt, or unprofessional misconduct or providing untrue information, and are able to comply with Mercy Corps Anti bribery and Anti- corruption statements.
- Supplier (or supplier's principals) are on any list of the sanctioned parties issued by; or are presently excluded or disqualified from participation in this transaction by: the United States Government or United Nations by the United States Government, by the United Kingdom, the United Nations, other national governments or public international organizations.

3.3 Tender Submittals

Documents and required information listed in tender submittals are necessary in order to support the eligibility criteria and to conduct technical evaluations of received offers (and due diligence).

Documents supporting the Eligibility Criteria:

1. Company certificate of Incorporation.
2. Tax registration certificate.
3. Current valid tax clearance certificate addressed to Mercy Corps.
4. Copy of a current valid trading license.
5. Recent bank statement for the last six months.
6. Clear company profile indicating physical location and company board members.
7. Memorandum and Articles of association with list of Directors.

Note: Sample will only be requested from the selected bidder before a purchase contract is placed.

Price Offer:

The price offer is used to determine which offer represents the best value and serves as a basis of negotiation before award of a contract. As a fixed price/ rates contract, the rates of the items will be an all-inclusive fixed price basis, Mercy Corps intends to enter into a contract with one or more service providers for the supply of Printing Care Group Module 3 Training Materials. **The contract entered does not consist of a financially binding agreement. Once signed, Purchase Order/Service Contract will be issued on a one-off basis under specific contract terms and constitute as the only financially binding document between the two parties.** As per the nature of this agreement, Mercy Corps is not legally bound to purchase any items/services from the selected vendor (s) and as such this agreement does give any exclusivity to Mercy Corps business. No profit, fees, taxes, or additional costs can be added after contract signing. Offerors must show unit prices inclusive of all applicable taxes as displayed in the offer sheet *section 6*.

3.4 Currency

Offers should be submitted in: **SDG**

Payments will be made in: **SDG**

The currency of choice will be indicated on the price offer sheet.

Offers in any other hard currency **MUST** indicate the ruling exchange rate.

3.5 Tender Evaluation

Based on the above submittals, a Mercy Corps tender committee will conduct a tender evaluation process. To assist in the examination and selection process, Mercy Corps may, at its discretion, assemble and establish a review committee, which may include representatives of other entities.

Mercy Corps reserves the right to accept or reject any or all bids, and to accept the bid deemed to be in the best interest of Mercy Corps. Mercy Corps will not be responsible for or pay for any expenses or losses which may be incurred by any offeror in the preparation of his tender. Mercy Corps is not bound to accept the lowest price bid submitted. The award criteria will be based on lowest price among bids that meet all technical requirements. Other important requirements such as payment terms and maximum delivery time will be set by Mercy Corps. (quality, cost, delivery time, samples submitted etc.) while taking into consideration internal requirements and donor regulations. Mercy Corps will examine all responses to ensure that they contain no amendment to the terms or any other irregularities and/or errors.

Evaluations will be conducted as described in the following subsections:

3.5.1 Technical Evaluation

Technical/Capacity Evaluation:

Only bidders who meet/ pass all the eligibility criteria will be contacted to submit samples of each of the materials required.

Responses will first be evaluated on technical merits. The technical evaluation assesses the capacity of the response, based on its submitted technical documents, specifications, performance history, and references submitted. For this purpose, certificates and additional references may be requested and subsequently examined. Mercy Corps tender committee will conduct a technical evaluation which will grade technical criteria on a pass/fail basis. Supplier’s bids **must meet the minimum technical standard** established here in order to receive a passing mark.

Only offerors who pass all criteria will move on to the next round of evaluation.

Pass/fail technical criteria is as follows:

3.5.2 Financial evaluation and price/cost analysis

All suppliers who passed all technical criteria will move on to the financial evaluation where the lowest price offer(s) will be accepted as the winning offeror(s) assuming the price is deemed fair and reasonable and subject to the additional due diligence in section 3.5.3.

3.5.3 Additional Due Diligence

Upon completion of both the technical and financial evaluations Mercy Corps may choose to engage in additional due diligence processes with a particular offeror or offeror(s). The purpose of these processes is to ensure that Mercy Corps engages with reputable, ethical, responsible suppliers with solid financials and the ability to fulfill the contract. Additional due diligence may take the form of the following processes (though it is not limited to):

- Reference Checks
- Determination of relations and affiliations between offerors
- Other appropriate documented method giving Mercy Corps increased confidence in the supplier’s ability to perform.
- Verification of submitted legal documents.

1. Offer Form

Offerors must submit their offer including at least (but not limited to):

- All documents requested in the “eligibility criteria” section of this tender package.
- All documents requested in the “tender submittals” section of this tender package.
- All information listed in the “documents comprising the bid” section below.

All offers must be duly signed indicating position and full name of the signer and stamped, with the date of completion.

Documents Comprising the Bid

The following information must be included in the offer of any potential offeror:

- **Cover Letter** explaining interest to be a contracted vendor or supplier. The content of the cover letter shall include the following information:
 - A detailed specification of the offered goods, services and/or works.
 - Warranty (if necessary and appropriate)
 - Delivery time from order date
 - Price validity date (for this purpose and as stated on the advertisement, quote given shall remain unchanged for 12 – 24 calendar months)
- A Price Offer detailing the unit price only using the **price offer sheet** provided in section 6
- Completed and signed Mercy Corps **supplier information form** (provided in section 6)
- Other important documents offeror feels need to be attached to support their bid.
- A copy of company legal registration documents including but not limited registration certificate, tax registration certificate, tax clearance certificate, names of directors, trading license.
- Proof of experience in similar supplies/ services.

The original bid shall be signed by the offeror, or a person or persons duly authorized (powers of attorney) to bind the offeror to the contract. Financial offer pages of the bid shall be initialed by the person or persons signing the bid and stamped.

Any interlineations, erasures, or overwriting shall be valid only if they are initialed by the person or persons signing the bid.

Supplier Self-Certification of Eligibility

Company certifies that:

1. It, its affiliates and subsidiaries, owners, officers, directors and key employees (to the best of its knowledge) are not the subject of any government’s sanctions, designations, donor rules or prohibitions, or laws prohibiting transactions with it/them. 7. It provides workers compensation insurance to its workers in accordance with the laws of the countries where it operates.
8. It pays social security obligations as required in the countries where it operates.
9. It, its owners, officers and directors have not been convicted of an offense concerning its professional conduct and has not engaged in grave professional misconduct.
10. It, its affiliates and subsidiaries, owners, officers, directors and key employees have not been the subject of criminal investigation or judgement for fraud, corruption, human trafficking, spying, weapons transport or smuggling, sexual exploitation or abuse, involvement in a criminal organization or any other criminal activity.
11. It treats its employees with dignity and respect and maintains social operating standards, including: working conditions and social rights: avoidance of child labor, bondage, forced labor, human trafficking or exploitation; assurance of safe and reasonable working conditions; freedom of association; freedom from exploitation, abuse, and discrimination; protection of basic social rights of its employees and Mercy Corps beneficiaries.
12. To the best of its knowledge, no Mercy Corps employee, officer, consultant or other party related to Mercy Corps has a financial interest in the Company's business activities, nor is any Mercy Corps employee related to any owner, officer, director or employee of the company, and, if so, it will ensure that the relationship is disclosed to Mercy Corps and will not use for improper influence. Discovery of an undisclosed Conflict of Interest will result in immediate revocation of the Company's Authorized Supplier status and disqualification of Company from participation in future Mercy Corps procurement.
13. It understands that attempting to or agreeing to provide anything of value to any Mercy Corps employee, agent or representative for the purpose of encouraging that person to award Company a contract or take or not take any action related to any contract will result in immediate termination of any agreement. Company certifies that it does not engage in such conduct.
14. It understands that Mercy Corps seeks fair and open competition and the fairest price available and that any attempt by company to subvert fair and open competition, including working with other bidders to fix prices, working to exclude competition, seeking confidential information from Mercy Corps or other bidders, using multiple related or controlled companies to give the appearance of competition, or any similar activity, will result in termination of any agreement. Company certifies that it does not engage in such conduct.
15. It understands that Mercy Corps prohibits any of its partners or suppliers from bribing public officials and certifies that it does not do so.

16. It is not conducting business under other names or aliases that have not been declared to Mercy Corps.

If the Company cannot certify to any of the above, it should explain why not. Mercy Corps may take the individual circumstances into account for some situations. However, any false certification could be grounds for immediate disqualification and termination of any future agreement.
