1. Consultancy assignment background

Livelihood support to refugees, IDPs and host community in Sudan remains hampered by the economic downturn, movement restrictions and access to work permits¹. There is a projected deterioration with estimated 9.7 million likely to be in IPC crisis from September 2021². Despite such challenge, NRC seeks to innovatively work with partners to promote self-reliance and resilience of communities is South Kordofan by promoting economic inclusion, employability and income opportunities to enhance its contribution to durable solution³. This is in line with NRC vision "people protected right respected"⁴, this coins well with Government of Sudan 2019 Global Refugee Forum commitment by supporting the market and increase economic activities⁵.

South Kordofan State is deemed a hot spot for conflict, the conflict takes the form of tribal conflict over perceived discriminatory practices against the Nubians and also conflict over natural resources and the prolonged state of insecurity resulting from the conflict between the Government of Sudan and the SPLM-N. This led to several problems especially internal displacement where 217,693⁶ or 9% of total IDP in the country, contamination of land with mines/unexploded remnant of war leading to limited access to productive land. Considering that South Kordofan borders with South Sudan the state is hosting 3.7% of South Sudan refugees 31,171 (HCR 30 June 2021). The Juba Peace Talks made some access possible for humanitarian intervention but it's very constricted and as yet INGOs working on GoS side cannot cross into SPLM-N areas to work. These conflicts over natural resources and intertribal clashes occur especially in the rainy season between farmers and pastoralists and also conflict over natural resource extraction [gold mining especially in Eastern Corridor] all of the above making South Kordofan a fragile state with major needs for humanitarian and early recovery assistance

2. Objective and Scope of Work

Objectives

The main purpose of the consultancy is:

NRC is seeking for services of a consultancy to conduct scoping of viable livelihoods and food security opportunities with IDPs, refugees, returnees and impacted host communities in South Kordofan. The assessment seeks to address the unsustainable natural resource management by diversification of

livelihoods options (on farm, off-farm, Income Generation Activities, and youth skilling based on context) sustainable livelihoods option (livelihoods asset in sustainable livelihoods framework). Therefore, the Consultant will be required to map viable sustainable livelihoods option in the areas of Kadugli locality related to IDPs as well as relevant host communities, as well as assessing opportunities to invest in affordable energy alternatives for local communities.

The action will require both primary and secondary data to identify opportunities to guide transitioning NRC LFS response from immediate need toward medium and long-term intervention by building self-reliance and resilience. The Consultant will consider existing literature related to natural resource management, existing practices, and population adoption of alternative energy in South Kordofan and possibility of community managed natural resource management in South Kordofan in partnership with government and other stakeholder.

The consultant will also be required to map all existing viable livelihoods opportunities, which can be supported to reduce negative coping strategy of heavy reliance on natural resources to meet immediate livelihoods needs, being cognizant for a safe and inclusive process especially regarding age, gender and diversity in participation to ensure inclusiveness.

Scope

The Consultant will be required to go through existing literature as well conduct primary data collection from host communities as well from IDPs and refugees/returnees in Kadugli locality, engage with government key departments responsible for natural resource management, Ministry of Social Development [?], Ministry of Agriculture/Livestock, as well as the Humanitarian Aid Commission (HAC) to provide direction in relation to government commitment to durable solutions.

The exercise will cover period 1st November to 16th December 2021 for desk review, primary data collection, analysis, draft reporting, feedback and final report submission as payment.

Geographical coverage: Kadugli locality

Key analytical questions:

- 1. What potential alternative energy sources can be promoted to reduced fuel wood consumption in Kadugli
- 2. What capacities exist to promote adoption of the alternative sources of energy and what are existing institutions in Kadugli and Khartoum (policy level) to promote these technologies.
- 3. What are the possible livelihoods diversification options for the community to reduce negative coping strategy in meeting basic needs?
- 4. What local institution exist and or accessible to promote sustainable livelihood option in South Kordofan for partnership?

5. Methodology

To ensure that all segment of the target population are reached, NRC propose used of both primary and secondary data to capture previous related assessment as well get on time relevant information from communities, leaders, government and other NGOs. Below are some of the suggestions for consideration



- Desk review of existing data and or information: Assessment reports, existing policies and strategies;
- o Primary data collection: Key informant interviews and Focus group discussions with target groups and stakeholders;
- o Workshops, meetings, brainstorming sessions.

The consultant will capitalize on their long experience and make necessary suggestion and inclusion of additional data collection tools to add value to this project.

6. Management of the assessment

NRC M&E unit will technically support supervise the consultant to ensure validity of the tools; this will be done through pretest and adjustment of the tools before field data collection. All enumerators will be taken through tool administration and interpretation of question to ensure accuracy of data. Necessary step will be taken to ensure participation of all segments of the population through cultural sensitivity and alignment to participants' cultural practices. The voluntary participation is a control measure for information accuracy however probing and assessment team will use other facilitation skills. The technical proposal will outline additional data quality control will be implemented and how data will be processed.

The main contact point for the consultant is Livelihoods and Food Security Project Manager South Kordofan. The PM and M&E department will support the consultant in the process of review of tools, selection of data enumerators, mobilization of population, and arranging logistics considering the presence in the area.

7. Data protection and confidentiality

NRC is compliance to data protection policy (GDPR), this will be adhered to through training of the research assistant on research ethic and professional administration of data collection tool. Every respondent will have informed consent before engagement, participation is voluntary, and all respondents anonymized. Data will be collected and recorded in an electronic system ODK secured in NRC cloud system. For KII and FGD, information recorded in hard copy, necessary steps will be taken to anonymize respondent, and response, names and any personal data, which may compromise protection of participant will not be documented. No pictures will be taken of children/minors during this exercise.

8. Deliverables

The expected deliverables are:

- o Detailed work plan with clear key milestones;
- o Precise English report in both hard and soft copies. The report must be maximum 30 pages with clear recommendation based on assessment information and appendices;
- o A power point presentation for the study to be presented in experts' consultation workshop;
- o Incorporate the outcomes of experts meeting in the final report.

10. Qualification of the consultancy company

- o In-depth knowledge in economic analysis of humanitarian/development projects;
- o Excellent communication and demonstrable team leadership experience;
- o An in-depth knowledge and understanding of the political dynamics of the Sudan and its history of relations between tribes, governments, and political organs. Knowledge of the South Kordofan context is desirable;
- o Fluency in written and spoken English for all team members;
- o Fluency in written and spoken Arabic is mandatory for the data collection team deployed on for the field data collection;
- o Experience in integrating conflict sensitivity strategies while carry data collection and analysis;
- o Practical application of cross cutting themes like age, gender and diversity and protection mainstreaming;
- Excellent computer skills (word processing, spreadsheets, statistical analysis software application, internet research, etc.);
